- Overseeing the operation, maintenance and repair of chapel instruments including pianos, organ, harpsichord, and various percussion.
- Leading and providing administrative support for the Liturgy Committee.
- Assures Art and Environment ambiance for the chapel is planned and created for liturgical seasons and feasts.
- Accompanies liturgies on piano or organ and teaches the congregation music that will enhance communal prayer.
- Maintains appropriate copyrights for music usage, maintaining needed records and renewals.
