General Summary:

The Bilingual Digital Presence Graduate Assistant provides critical support to the digital presence consultant to advance the goals of the Lilly Grant in Neuroscience and Preaching. The grant focuses on analyzing feedback from Catholic worshippers about effective preaching through collaboration with the University of Chicago's APEX lab. This position ensures efficient digital project management, smooth communication, and content organization in both English and Spanish, contributing to the project's four-year trajectory (2024-2027).

This role requires fluency in digital tools and platforms, effective teamwork, and an interest in the intersection of science and liturgy.

Key responsibilities include:

- Organizing and maintaining Google Drive files
- Managing website (English and Spanish) content & organizing digital assets (photos, documents, etc.)
- Assisting in social media management, content creation, and email marketing
- Supporting digital advertising and press release campaigns
- Carry out additional tasks as needed or assigned, aligned with the responsibilities & scope of this role
